

Annual Report – AI Commission 2025

Activities in 2025 and Outlook for 2026

1. Events and Outreach (2025)

In 2025, the AI Commission actively contributed to national and regional professional events and organized targeted training sessions.

Participation in national events

- **Bibliosuisse GetTogether**
 - March 2025 (German-speaking edition)
 - November 2025 (French-speaking edition)
- **Schweizer Bibliothekskongress 2025**
 - One workshop: “*AI in Libraries*”
 - Two sessions in the format “*Meeting Insel*”

The results of the workshop and the *Meeting Insel* sessions will be published in *INFO Bibliosuisse*.

Commission-led events and workshops

- **Bibliosuisse AI Forum (September 2025)**

First edition of the Commission-led online forum for discussing current AI issues in libraries, attended by over 80 participants, and with a special guest presentation from Christiane Sibille of the ETH Library.

- **AILIS Training, Geneva (November 2025)**
One-day training focused on AI literacy.
- **Renouvaud Network (March 2025)**
Presentation of the AI Commission and its objectives, and of examples of services implemented in libraries of different kind.
- **Bildungszentrum für Wirtschaft Weinfelden (June 2025)**
Workshop on AI use and AI literacy for teachers of history and politics.
- **University of Freiburg**

Presentation of the AI Commission and its objectives, and of examples of services created and implemented by libraries of different kind.

2. Cooperation and Internal Coordination

Cooperation with the Weiterbildungskommission

The AI Commission contributed to the development of an AI literacy matrix and provided ideas for workshops and training formats within the Bibliosuisse continuing education program.

3. Subgroups of the Commission

In 2025, the AI Commission worked through three thematic subgroups:

- **AI Literacy**
This subgroup focuses on competencies and educational approaches related to AI. Due to changes in membership, a reorganization of this subgroup is planned.
- **AI Forum**
The *KI Forum* is a new online format introduced by Bibliosuisse and exclusively open to members.
 - Takes place approximately four times per year : two sessions are conducted in German and two in French
 - Provides space for exchange, presentation of AI-related projects, and sharing of practical experiences
 - Participation is free of charge
 - The AI Forum will be continued in 2026.
- **Policy Issues**
This subgroup is currently working on an AI statement in cooperation with other commissions, notably the Ethics Commission and the Legal Commission.
A draft document is planned for spring 2026.

4. Events Calendar

The AI Commission maintains an **AI Events Calendar**, which provides a continuously updated overview of events related to artificial intelligence for librarians.

5. Networking and International Exchange

- **AG KI VÖB (Austria)**
Exchange with colleagues in Austria.
- **Germany**
The commission plans to establish a network with German colleagues.
A first meeting is planned at the **IK-DACH Conference 2026**.

6. Outlook and Further Initiatives (2026)

The AI Commission is considering facilitating the **“Casse-tête de l’IAg” (Generative AI Puzzle or Fresco)** as a methodological tool to support AI literacy initiatives in 2026.

The AI Forum will be held on two dates in the first half of the year.
